- CKYO engages over 450 students weekly from 40+ schools across 12 counties.
- Programs include:
 - 7 audition-based ensembles.
 - 2 community programs (Friends in Music and MusicWorks).
- Season Highlights:
 - 5 mainstage concerts at Singletary Center.
 - Concerto Competition with 21 advanced musicians.
- Community Programs:
 - Friends in Music participation doubled at Leestown and Bryan Station Middle Schools.
 - MusicWorks to relocate to William Wells Brown Elementary in Fall 2025.
- Key partnerships:
 - FCPS support for space and promotion.
 - Lexmark reduced printing costs by 70% through In-Kind support of printing program booklets.
- Fundraising accomplishments:
 - Two-year LFUCG ESR grant for Friends in Music.
 - Ongoing LA Philharmonic support for MusicWorks.
 - Support from BGCF donor-advised funds, Roop Foundation, and Virginia Clark Hagan Foundation.
 - \$10,000 Good Giving Challenge prize for MusicWorks Endowment (third consecutive win).

- FY 2024–2025:
 - Beginning cash: \$64,175.
 - Projected ending cash: ~\$16,000 (budgeted negative cash flow).
 - o Revenues: ~\$479,000 | Expenses: ~\$528,000 | Net loss: (\$49,000).
 - Loss covered by Baird investment withdrawals.
- Successes:
 - Increased ticket sales and ensemble participation.
 - Increased non-endowed grant support.
 - Maintained sponsorships and staff.
 - MusicWorks Endowment: 3rd consecutive Good Giving Challenge prize.
- Challenges:
 - Decline in general operating donations and corporate sponsorships.
 - Inflation impacting operating costs.
- Tuition covers 64% of orchestra costs; financial aid available.
- FY 2025–2026 Budget:
 - Revenues: \$491,585 | Expenses: \$533,356 | Net loss: (\$41,371).
 - Expenses reflect mainly fixed costs (salaries, rent).
- Forward Plans:
 - Focus on alumni and corporate fundraising.
 - Recruit for increased audition participation.
 - MusicWorks relocating to William Wells Brown Elementary.
