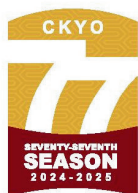

Emerson Farrar, Violin, Bryan Station High School

Emerson Farrar is a senior at Bryan Station High School and is part of the Spanish Immersion Program and Station Arts. He began violin at the age of 3 under the tutelage of Meg Saunders, following in his brother, Griffin, and sister, Madeline's, footsteps. Since 2019, he has been lucky enough to study under the guidance of Professor Daniel Mason, who has helped him grow as a musician and a person. He has been part of CKYO since 4th grade, part of Symphony Orchestra since 9th grade, and was in All-State Symphony 1st violin section each year. He has also been a mentee and mentor for Friends in Music. Recently, he joined the CKYO Jazz Arts orchestra as a bass player. Additionally, he was part of the award winning CKYO String Quartet from 2022-2024. In the summers, he has attended Governor's School for the Arts, New England Music Camp, and the Louisville Suzuki Institute. Finally, Emerson was honored to play his concerto with the Symphony Orchestra this February. Emerson will be attending Emory University in Atlanta as a Woodruff Scholar where he will study Chemistry, Spanish, and Music. She's also earned seats in the KMEA All-State Orchestra and District 7 Honor Bands throughout her high school career. Next fall, Tamara will be attending the University of Kentucky to study music and prelaw.
